Cancer-fighting Chef to Present in Dayton

Chef Sualua Tupolo, presenter and educator for the Washington D. C.-based Cancer Project will be presenting a 4-hour cooking class Sunday afternoon, August 13, at the Dayton Chamber of Commerce Welcome Center. His topic is "Food for Life: Nutrition and Cooking for Cancer Prevention and Survival." The class, free to the public (but reservations required), will help participants better understand the connection between healthy nutrition and cancer prevention and survival. He will be demonstrating, with food samples for participants, how to cook with foods that are rich in cancer-fighting phyto-nutrients and anti-oxidants.



Chef Sualua (which is how he likes to be called) is currently Executive Chef/Director of Culinary Arts and Food Service at Atlantic Union College in South Lancaster, Massachusetts. He began his culinary training as a pot washer in the food service industry and gradually moved up the ladder as prep cook, Chef de Partie, Sous Chef, and Executive Chef in some of the world's finest kitchens. He began his formal culinary training in 1976 at the San Francisco City College Culinary Arts Hotel and Restaurant.

Earlier in his career, which now spans 31 years in the industry, Chef Sualua helped prepare meals for celebrities such as Ronald Reagan, Frank Sinatra, and Sammy Davis, Jr. Throughout the years Chef Sualua has also been the Touring Chef for three Governors of American Samoa, where he prepared meals for special government functions, the Senate, Congress, heads of state, members of Parliament, the King of Tonga, and many other dignitaries.

Just last week Chef Sualua, now a CVC or certified vegetarian/vegan chef, fulfilled an invitation by national legislators to present at the House of Representatives in the Rayburn Office on Capital Hill in Washington, D. C. The chef headed up Weimar College Vegan/Culinary Arts in Weimar, California from 2002-2005. He has also initiated the Culinary Arts Degree at Atlantic Union College, where he now works.

The Cancer Project's "Food for Life" series was developed by Neal Barnard, M.D., president and founder of The Cancer Project along with two colleagues. This project is a collaborative effort of physicians, researchers, and nutritionists who have joined together to educate the public on how a healthy diet can protect from cancer, as well as enable cancer survivors to regain health once the disease has been diagnosed. Chef Sualua, a lifetime chef, presents the cooking portion of the Food for Life series.

When asked why he has gone from a meat-based perspective to one of vegetarianism, Chef Sualua says, "I enjoy promoting health reform and teaching vegan culinary arts. I enjoy sharing the art of vegan cooking and helping people adopt more healthy life styles."

Chef Sualua's presentations will be a combination of videoed health tips and a live cooking demonstration. He will present two actual two-hour classes with a short break between. In the process, he will cook four complete meals.
